

# Boosting learning

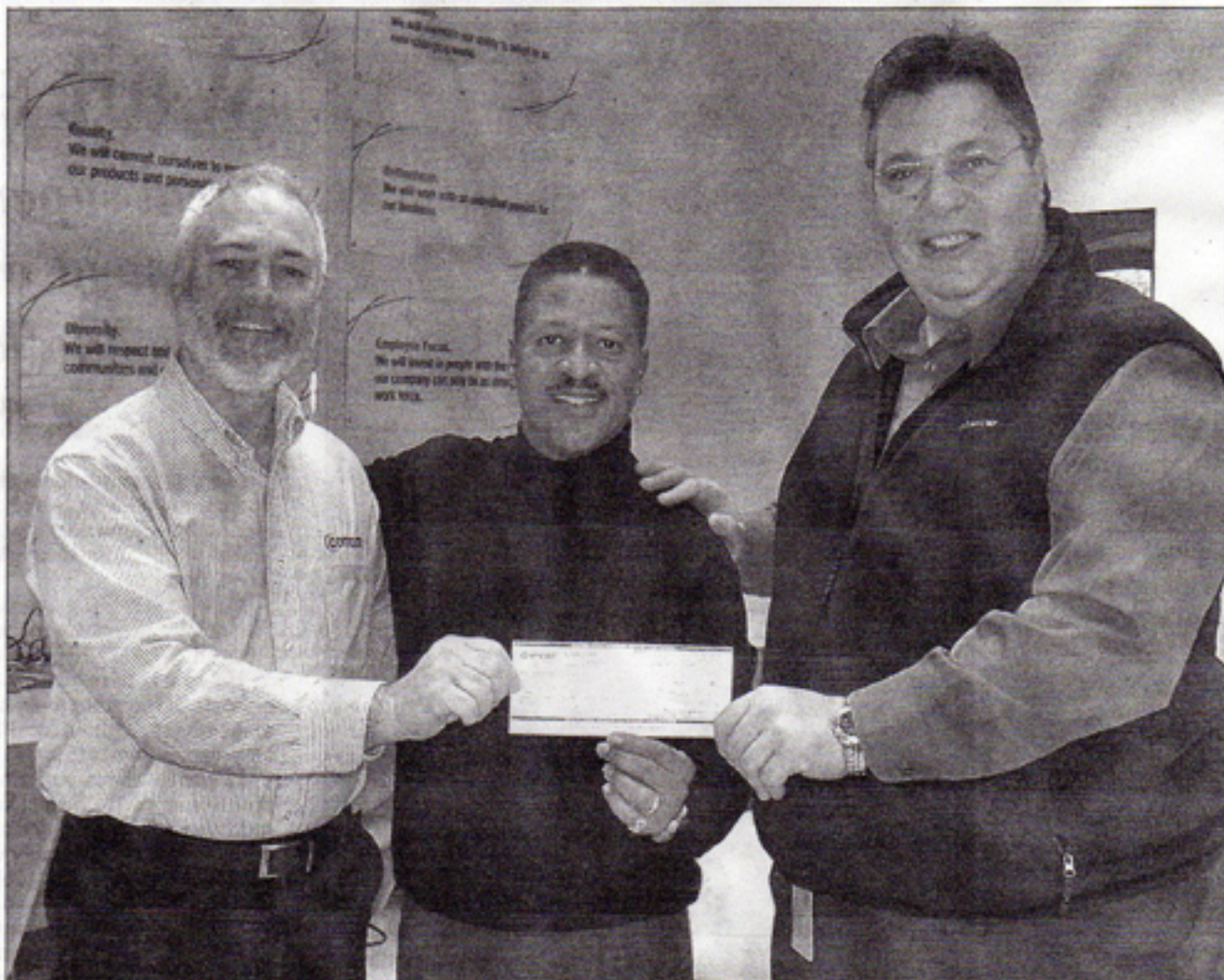
