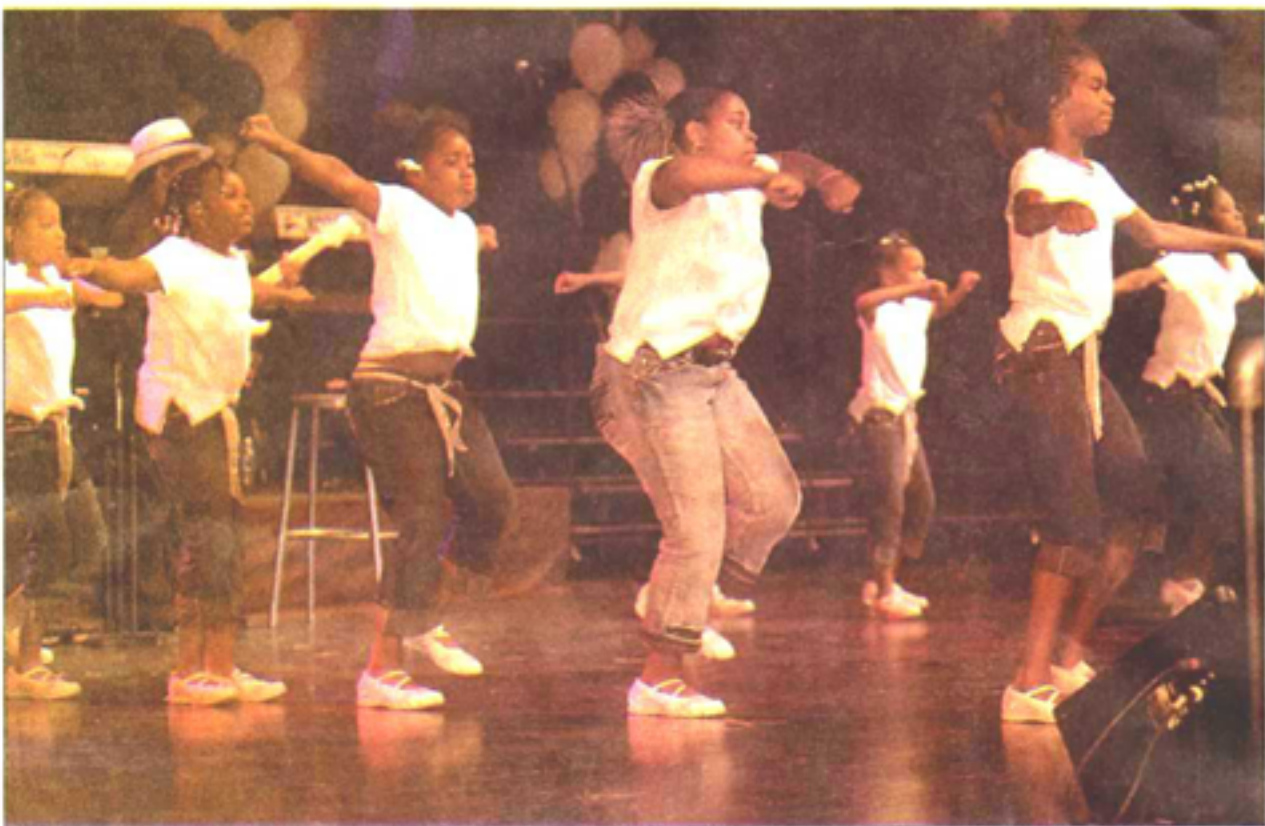


CAPPA on the move



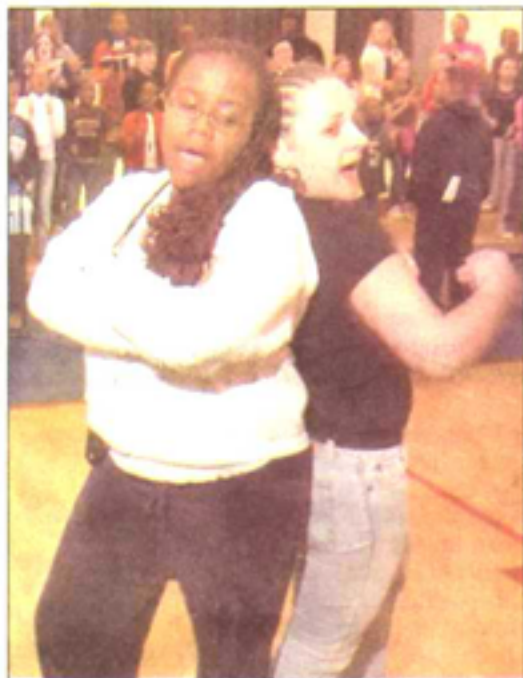
Program added, summer concert series launched
