
The city's police chief Tuesday afternoon urged young basketball players at Penn Vale housing project in Loyalsock Township to act responsibly and strive to be their best.

Chief John McKenna helped open the fifth-annual Youth Summer Basketball League, sponsored by the Community Alliance for Progressive Positive Action, CAPPA, at the project managed by the Lycoming County Housing Authority.

The court was alive with chatter of children eager to play and families watching from chairs beneath shade trees around the paved court.

McKenna was joined by Timothy Fausnaught, principal of Loyalsock Township Middle School, who told the children to "be strong and courageous."
